GOLBORNE ST THOMAS' CE J & I SCHOOL

CCTV POLICY

1 Introduction

- 1.1 St Thomas' CE J & I School uses closed circuit television (CCTV) images to reduce crime and monitor school buildings in order to provide a safe and secure environment for pupils, staff and visitors, and to prevent the loss or damage to school property.
- 1.2 The system comprises a number of fixed cameras.
- 1.3 The system does not have sound recording capability.
- 1.4 The CCTV system is owned and operated by the school, the deployment of which is determined by the senior leadership team.
- 1.5 The CCTV is monitored from the Site Manager's office by the Site Manager, with the capacity to be viewed in the admin office and the STEM room by the Site Manager and the Admin Team. The school data controller for CCTV is Tina Christmas.
- 1.6 The introduction of, or changes to, CCTV monitoring will be subject to consultation with the school staff and the school community.
- 1.7 The school's CCTV scheme is registered with the Information Commissioner under the terms of the Data Protection Act 1998. The use of CCTV, and the associated images, is covered by the Data Protection Act 1988. This policy outlines the school's use of CCTV and how it complies with the Act.
- 1.8 All authorised operators and employees with access to images are aware of the procedures that need to be followed when accessing the recorded images. All operators are trained by the school data controller in their responsibilities under the CCTV Code of Practice. All employees are aware of the restrictions in relation to access to, and disclosure of, recorded images.

2 Statement of Intent

2.1 The school complies with Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) CCTV Code of Practice to ensure it is used responsibly and safeguards both trust and confidence in its continues use. The Code of Practice is published at:

- 2.2 CCTV warning signs will be clearly and prominently placed at all external entrances to the school, including school gates if coverage includes outdoor areas. Signs will contain details of the purpose for using CCTV (see appendix A). In areas where CCTV is used, the school will ensure that there are prominent signs placed at both the entrance of the CCTV zone and within the controlled area.
- 2.3 The planning and design has endeavoured to ensure that the Scheme will give maximum effectiveness and efficiency but it is not possible to guarantee that they system will cover or detect every single incident taking place in the areas of coverage.

3 Siting the Cameras

- 3.1 Cameras will be sited so that they only capture images relevant to the purposes for which they are installed (described above) and care will be taken to ensure that reasonable privacy expectations are not violated. The school will ensure that the location of equipment is carefully considered to ensure that images captured comply with the Data Protection Act.
- 3.2 The school will make every effort to position cameras so that their coverage is restricted to the school premises, which may include outdoor areas.
- 3.3 CCTV will not be used in classroom but in areas within school that have been identified by staff and pupils as not being easily monitored.
- 3.4 Members of staff should have access to details of where CCTV cameras are situated.

4 Storage and Retention of CCTV images

- 4.1 Recorded data will not be retained for longer than is necessary. While retained, the integrity of the recordings will be maintained to ensure their evidential value and to protect the rights of the people whose images have been recorded.
- 4.2 All retained data will be stored securely.

5 Access to CCTV Images

5.1 Access to recorded images will be restricted to those staff authorised to view them, and will not be made widely available.

6 Subject Access Requests (SAR)

- 6.1 Individuals have the right to request access to CCTV footage relating to themselves under the Data Protection Act.
- 6.2 All requests should be made in writing to the Headteacher. Individuals submitting requests for access will be asked to provide sufficient information to enable the footage relating to them to be identified. For example date, time and location.
- 6.3 The school will respond to requests within 30 calendar days of receiving the written request.
- There will not be a fee incurred but the school reserves the right to charge a reasonable fee for manifestly unfounded or excessive requests.
- 6.5 The school reserves the right to refuse access to CCTV footage where this would prejudice the legal rights of other individuals or jeopardise an on-going investigation.

7 Access to and Disclosure of Images to Third parties

- 7.1 There will be no disclosure of recorded data to third parties other than to authorised personnel such as the Police and service providers to the school where these would reasonably need access to the date (e.g. investigators).
- 7.2 Requests should be made to the Headteacher.
- 7.3 The data may be used within the school's discipline and grievance procedures as required, and will be subject to the usual confidentiality requirements of those procedures.

9 Complaints

9.1 Complaints and enquiries about the operation of CCTV within the school should be directed to the Headteacher in the first instance.

Appendix B - CCTV Signage

It is a requirement of the Data Protection Act 1998 to notify people entering a CCTV protected area that the area is monitored by CCTV and that pictures are recorded. The school is to ensure that this requirement is fulfilled.

The CCTV sign should include the following:

- That the area is covered by CCTV surveillance and pictures are recorded
- The purpose of using CCTV
- The name of the school
- The contact telephone number or address for enquiries
