PSHE Policy

PSHE is taught throughout the curriculum here at St Thomas' and is given the upmost importance that it deserves. Through PSHE, pupils are given the opportunity to develop their knowledge and skills on how to be healthy, safe and a caring member of our school. Through a range of lessons and experiences pupils are encouraged to deepen their understanding of the outside world, ultimately leading to a better understanding of life in modern Britain. Our aim is to promote spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of our pupils, both in school and in the wider world. We help children to develop an appreciation of how to behave responsibly, courteously and to have consideration for others.

PSHE at Golborne St. Thomas'

Our objectives are to enable children to:

• Know and understand what constitutes a healthy lifestyle

- Understand how to build good relationships with others, both within school and the outside community
- Have respect for others who are different from themselves
- Be aware of how to keep themselves and other safe
- Be independent and responsible members of the school community
- Develop their self-confidence and self-esteem and make informed choices regarding personal and social issues

Teaching and Learning style

PSHE is taught both as a singular subject and in other subjects across the curriculum. Our school use SCARF (an online resource to access materials that are in line with the government curriculum) and P4C (philosophy for children) in order to deliver PSHE lessons. We also use PSHE through other areas of the school such as, collective worship, school council, Woodland's sessions and Ethos group. HH kids deliver sessions on puberty for year 5 and 6. Using SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship), pupils are taught well structured lessons that are in line with the PSHE association programmes of study. In addition to using this, we provide many enrichment activities to support the curriculum such as, Healthy Schools Week, Anti-bullying Week, mindfulness activities and cultural events and dance classes.

Assessment and recording

Teachers assess children's work in PSHE by making informal judgements as they observe them during lessons. We use Seesaw to evidence any work we have completed and use displays to demonstrate our work.

Governors

It is the duty of the governors to ensure that the school follows its responsibilities to ensure that the PSHE policy and curriculum are in line with the non-statutory guidance in the National Curriculum 2014.
